FIRST COMMUNION CLASSES

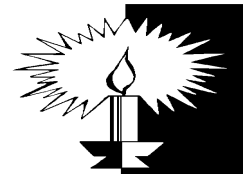

ISRAEL: A JOURNEY TO THE HOLY LAND

Fr. Paul Gousse, pastor of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary and St. Leo Parishes, along with Fr. Moe Larochele of Ste. Marie and Sacred Heart Parishes will be leading a pilgrimage of Israel and the Holy Land October 3-22, 2010. Highlights of the pilgrimage include: Tel Aviv, Jaffa, Caesarea, Tiberias, Sea of Galilee, Nazareth, Jericho, Dead Sea, Masada, Qumran, Jerusalem, Wailing Wall, Bethlehem, Church of the Nativity, Mount of Olives and Mt. Zion. Walk along the Via Dolorosa or Way of Sorrows to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, the site of Jesus' crucifixion, burial and resurrection. Observe the solemnity of the Western Wall, the only surviving remnant of Judaism's most sacred shrine, the Temple Mount, and gaze in awe at one of the world's most architectural masterpieces, the Dome of the Rock. FONTANINI NATIVITY

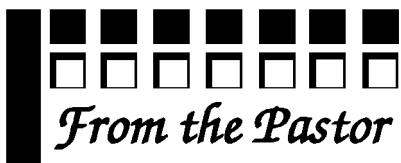

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL
