GRANITE STATE CHORAL SOCIETY

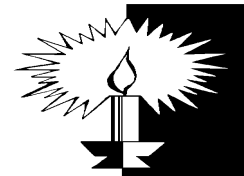

LET'S IMPROVE MEDICAID TOGETHER

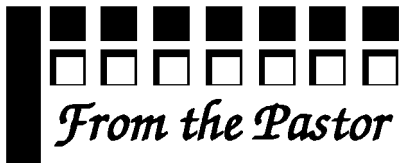
