

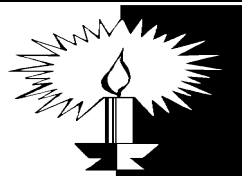

Dear Friends,  
The monthly "Food Procession Sundays" at Saint Mary's and the "Brown Bag Sundays" at Saint Peter's continually leave me in awe at your generous spirit. I know that many people in both our communities are struggling, some are out of work, and many have family members in grave need – yet you continue to give in the spirit of Jesus to alleviate the burden of others. Last weekend, I inquired at Saint Mary's just how much was delivered to Gerry's Food Pantry. If you have ever wondered, here is the total for May's Food Procession Sunday: 81 bags of groceries and \$143 in cash & checks! On behalf of all who will be assisted by your generosity, thank you!

It was reported to me last weekend by a Saint Mary's parishioner that certain folks attending Mass are not only leaving early, but are also **using the cemetery** to hasten their departure! **Life Line Screening**

Life Line Screening will be at St. Mary's Catholic Church, Rochester, on Monday, August 31<sup>st</sup> for preventive screenings. These screenings are fast, painless and offered at low cost. They involve the use of ultrasound technology, and they scan for potential health problems related to blocked arteries. Also offered for men and women is a bone density screening to assess their risk for osteoporosis. The screenings take about 90 minutes to complete. The Wellness package, which includes all tests, is \$129.00. Sign up for an EKG to detect an irregular heartbeat, and pay only \$20 more. See insert for more details

**QUESTION OF THE WEEK**

**1. Call to Prayer.**

**Leader:** My friends, let's pause to spend a few moments in prayer and conversation with each other. (Lead all in the Sign of the Cross.) In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

**2. The Word of God**

**Leader:** May the Lord be in our hearts as we recall and listen to a reading from last Sunday's Liturgy of the Word.

First reading: Deuteronomy 4: 32-34 39-40

Second reading: Romans 8: 14-17

Gospel reading: Matthew 28: 16-20

Reading suggested for this week: **Today's Gospel**

**3. The Two Faith Sharing Questions**

**Leader:** As we consider this Sacred Scripture, I invite you to think about it in two dimensions:

First, ask about the text itself, to draw attention to the Scripture

- What word or phrase in this text caught your ear?
- What story did you hear, or image did you get?
- What touched you as you heard this reading?

Second, when this first sharing is complete, ask about the people's lives.

- Use this "Question of the Week" to help people get starting sharing faith:

**As you are called and sent by Christ into the world of today, how do you respond – whether you are single, married, in religious life or ordained?**

**4. The Prayer.** At the end of the sharing period, invite folks to pray in one of the following ways:

- The Lord's Prayer out loud together
- Spontaneous prayers
- A moment of silent prayer
- Listen to a recorded hymn.
